Top Jobs for April

- 1 Remove frost protection from tender plants but remain vigilant in case of late frosts
- 2 Repair bumps and hollows in lawns, adding new turfs or re-seeding where necessary
- 3 Prick out annual seedlings when they have 2 true leaves. Keep indoors until warmer
- 4 Direct-sow sweet peas or plant out those grown under cover
- 5 Renovate evergreen shrubs taking care not to disturb nesting birds
- 6 Cut back cotinus and sambucas
- 7 To keep pests off brasicas and carrots cover with horticultural fleece
- 8 Sow vegetable and salad crops outside now eg beetroot, carrot, chard, lettuce.
- 9 Ensure bird baths contain fresh water
- 10 Feed and tie-in rambling and climbing roses
