Top 10 jobs for February - When in doubt Prune and Mulch!

- 1. Prune "cool season" ornamental grasses close to ground level
- 2. Prune Wisteria and Campsis to 3 or 4 buds of last year's growth.
- 3. Prune late summer & autumn-flowering clematis(gr. 3) to lowest pair of strong buds.
- 4. Cut back fuchsias, santolina and lavatera to low well-placed branches.
- 5. Mulch shrubs, trees, hedges and climbers after pruning with manure or compost.
- 6. Prune winter-flowering heathers as the flowers fade.
- 7. Water Hostas in pots with Slug It /Slug Clear, if you have some. This works by killing the slug/snail eggs. However this has possibly been taken off the market. Madness!
- 8. Cut back autumn fruiting raspberries to ground level and mulch around stems.
- 9. Apply general fertilizers eg. Growmore/ blood fish and bone /chicken manure to beds
- 10.Ensure debris is cleared from under bird feeders to discourage visiting rodents. Spring is nearly here. Happy gardening.
