# Members' Spring Flower Show

This will take place at our 10<sup>th</sup> April meeting here at Charlton House old library. Schedule as follows:

#### CLASS:

- 1. DAFFODILS/NARCISSI 3 stems, one or more cultivars
- 2. TULIPS 3 stems, one or more cultivars
- 3. SHRUBS, FLOWERING 3 stems of any cultivar except camellias
- 4. CAMELLIAS one stem
- 5. SHRUBS, FOLIAGE 3 stems any cultivar
- 6. SMALL VASE OF MIXED SPRING FLOWERS
- 7. ANY POT-GROWN PLANT (indoor or outdoor)
- 8. SPRING BULBS COMPETITION 5 "Pipit" narcissisi in a pot
- 9. FLORAL ART arrangement of spring flowers. Space available 20" square. May be arranged at home. Flowers may be purchased
- 10. SPRING PHOTOGRAPHS OF YOUR GARDEN (up to 4 per person.) Max size A5 (or 210mm x 148mm ) or 8 1/4 "x 5 5/8"

Please remember to bring suitable vases in which to display your exhibits and place them in the appropriate classes upon arrival.

# **Top Tips**

- 1. Some vegetable seeds can be sown indoors now and planted out later.
- 2. Wait until temperatures go above 7 degrees before sowing parsnips, brasicas and beetroot.
- 3. It's not too late to prune floribunda and hybrid tea roses when no frost is forecast.
- 4. Divide overcrowded clumps of herbaceous perennials every fourth year
- 5. Prune perennials such as penstemen and perovskia to the lowest growing shoot
- 6. Cut back shrubs such as hydrangea and caryopteris to lowest pair of buds when no frost is forecast.
- 7. Continue mulching borders with 2-3 inches of organic matter before growth starts.
- 8. Clear lawns and mow on a high cut.
- 9. Apply blood fish and bone meal or Growmore around fruit trees and bushes.
- 10 Replace top of soil of permanent pot plants with fresh compost and repot where necessary.
