Top Tips

- 1 Hoe regularly to keep weeds under control
- 2 Put plant supports in place for tall-growing cottage plants eg Delphiniums & Digitalis
- 3 Prune spring flowering shrubs as soon as flowering is over.
- 4 Plant out young veg but be sure to harden off first.
- 5 Open greenhouse vents and doors on warm days
- 6 Mow lawns weekly
- 7 Watch out for viburnum beetle and bright red lily beetle
- 8 Plant out summer bedding in containers and borders towards the end of May.
- 9 "Chelsea Chop" late-flowering herbaceous perennials to reduce eventual height
- 10 Harvest rhubarb. Pull stalks from up to half of the crowns then water if dry.

May is one of the busiest months in the gardening year but don't forget to take time to sit back, relax and enjoy it from time to time.
