There will be many exhibits to admire, so it will be worth a visit to Coolings at Rushmore Hill, Knockholt, Kent, TN14 7NN, even if you are not entering. If you are unable to take your exhibit along but would like to enter please arrange to give your exhibits to either Kathy Aitken or Viv Parson who can take them for you.

### **Spring Bulb Competition**

Our society will be holding a competition to grow the best pot of Narcissi "Pipit" bulbs, to be exhibited at our Spring Flower Display next spring. The bulbs are available tonight, from our sales table, at 5 for £1.

### **Bulb Planting Tips:-**

### **Select Bulbs with Care**

Take time to plan your colour schemes. Often it is better to choose 2 or 3 colours or cultivars, using either striking contrasts or subtle, harmonious combinations for a calmer effect. Also consider the flowering period of all bulbs chosen so that they flower in succession or at the same time as required.

### **Spot Colour**

Small groups of bulbs tucked among perennials, shrubs, or rocks create bright accents. Use types with large flowers such as daffodils, tulips, and alliums, and group several together so they make a strong visual statement. If planting larger areas do not plant in straight lines but scatter them gently.

## Plant in Large Pots

Large containers do not dry out as quickly as smaller ones. Pots packed tightly with bulbs can be positioned strategically in the flowerbeds when the green shoots are just pushing through the surface. Don't forget to protect from squirrels and birds with chicken netting and also from slugs and snails. Remember to use a loam-based compost.

#### Winter Planters

When planting winter displays of pansies, cyclamen, hellebores etc. remember to plant bulbs underneath in layers. Start with the largest bulbs first and plant them deeply. Then gradually plant layers of bulbs of decreasing size, ending with the smallest bulbs such as muscari nearest the top.

### Top Tips for September

- 1 Divide herbaceous perennials such as phlox and hardy geraniums.
- 2 Continue to water patio plants and hanging baskets using tomato fertiliser
- 3 Keep up dead-heading on all autumn-flowering perennials to prolong flowering
- 4 Take cuttings of tender and semi-hardy plants eg. fuchsia, pelargonnium and salvia
- 5 Pick autumn-fruiting raspberries and cut down canes when fruiting has finished
- 6 Thin-out oxygenated and floating plants in ponds. Net ponds before autumn leaf fall. 7 Collect seed and store in dry, labelled & dated paper bags or envelopes
- 8 Select and plant out spring-flowering bulbs except tulips, which can be left until Nov.
- 9 After flowering, lift and store dahlias in a cool dry place or cut down & cover with a thick layer of garden compost and horticultural fleece to protect from frost.
- 10 Pot up some bulbs to enjoy over winter such as Narcissus Paper White. They will flower 4-6 weeks after potting.
