- 1 DAFFODILS / NARCISSI 3 stems, one or more cultivars
- 2 TULIPS 3 stems, one or more cultivars
- 3 SHRUBS, FLOWERING 3 stems of any cultivar except Camellias
- 4 CAMELLÍA, AZALEA or RHODODENDRON one stem
- **5 SMALL VASE OF MIXED SPRING FLOWERS**
- 6 ANY POT-GROWN PLANT (indoor or outdoor)
- 7 POT OF SPRING BULBS
- 8 PIPIT DAFFODILS competition
- 9 TEA CUP Floral Display arrange at home, flowers from garden or shop.

Please bring your own containers, but water is available at Charlton House for cut stems.

Pat's 10 jobs for March:

- 1. Time now to divide overcrowded perennials such as phlox and rudbeckia and replant elsewhere or bring in for the plant sale table.
- 2. Remove and replace the top 2 inches of compost in permanently planted pots of perennials and shrubs and give them a slow release feed.
- 3. Cut back last years growth on any remaining grasses to make way for new shoots.
- 4. Deadhead daffodils as they fade but allow the foliage to die back naturally.
- 5. Finish pruning Hybrid Tea and floribunda roses and give them a feed with a general purpose food and give them a good mulch with compost or grass clippings.
- 6. Prune coloured stems of Cornus so that growth comes through for next year which will be much brighter in colour.
- 7. Chit your seed potatoes by placing on a tray (empty egg boxes are good) and leaving in a bright place which is frost free. Plant in early to mid April.
- 8. .Fruit trees and bushes need a good feed this month with either a general purpose food such as bonemeal or pelleted chicken manure and mulch. I use sulphate of potash with good results.
- 9. Indoors a wide variety of seeds can be sown such as leeks, lettuce, onions and peas.
- 10. Put nesting material out for birds in a fatball cage such as wool and even hair groomed from pets.

Old Pond Garden restoration project: Huge thank you to all members who have given their precious gardening time to helping weed and tidy the beds. It is looking so much better already, and we just await news about our funding application before deciding what to plant in them. Whether you volunteer or not, please just come and visit these peaceful gardens and enjoy them. Even better, combine with a trip to see the new film of "The Secret Garden" with Julie Walters & Colin Firth, coming out at Easter. Then visit the real thing - we even have a resident robin, singing his heart out most days!
